



Jessica Kim is the U.S. Department of Justice’s Resident Legal Advisor for Romania and Bulgaria, providing justice sector assistance to build capacity in combating public corruption, money laundering, and organized crime. She also focuses on assessing and promoting procedural and legislative reforms, as well as building support for an effective judiciary, to promote the rule of law throughout Romania, Bulgaria, and the Central European region.

Kim is currently on detail from the U.S. Attorney’s Office for the Southern District of Ohio, U.S. Department of Justice, where she has served as an Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) since 2014. She focuses her practice on prosecuting white collar crimes, including public corruption, investment fraud, corporate fraud, wire fraud, money laundering, and cybercrimes. She also prosecutes national security and violent crime offenses. In 2018, Kim was awarded the Attorney General’s Award for Outstanding Contributions by a New Employee, which recognizes exceptional performance and notable accomplishments towards the Department’s mission by one employee within DOJ—all 115,000 employees—with fewer than five years of federal career service. This award was presented for exemplary work as an AUSA, including the landmark prosecutions of the district’s first two cyberstalking cases. She was also awarded the Federal Bar Association’s 2018 Younger Federal Lawyer Award, a national award for attorneys who have exemplified outstanding legal ability and commitment to the community.

Prior to joining the Department of Justice, Kim served as a judicial law clerk to the Honorable G. Steven Agee of the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. She also served as a judicial law clerk to the Honorable Edmund A. Sargus, Jr. of the United States District Court for the Southern District of Ohio. She is the Immediate Past President of the Columbus Chapter of the Federal Bar Association (2019–2020) and has served on the boards of several philanthropic organizations, including A Kid Again (Central Ohio Chapter), Leukemia and Lymphoma Society (Young Professionals Board of Central Ohio), the ProMusica Chamber Orchestra (Sustaining Board), and as a 100-mile rider and fundraiser for Pelotonia, an annual grassroots bike ride for cancer research. Since 2014, she has served as an Adjunct Professor of Law at Ohio State University, teaching white collar crime and appellate advocacy.
