Migration and cosmopolitanism are consubstantial: cosmopolitanism means to be a citizen of the world, with no borders, while migration means to move from one place to another. However, migration as practice reveals anti-cosmopolitan stances of countries of destination and the crossing the borders produces illegal/rightless subjects. This conference examines how migration and cosmopolitanism could regain their co-substantiality, and how can migration contribute to a cosmopolitan restructuring of the world, by addressing issues of political theory, such as migrants and refugees as the avant-garde of cosmopolitics, limits of cosmopolitan hospitality, migration as 'groundless ground' of cosmopolitanism, cosmopolitanism of statelessness and bare life, territorial cosmopolitics, and others.
